The young, light-weight appearance recalling the shape of a cigar, which ironically gives it its name, the soft light that it emits and the ease with which it blends in with the most varied contexts, have made it the great success that it is today, so much so that it is also part of the permanent collection on exhibit at the New York MoMA.

The diffuser consists of four satin finish polyethylene segments. Small round metal hooks hold two subsequent elements together without them touching, leaving room for three slim empty bands that fill up with light when the lamp is on.

Available in white, ice or custard yellow, Havana is available as a suspension, wall or floor lamp.

Floor lamp with diffused light. Diffuser consisting of four injection-moulded polyethylene parts joined by chromed metal hooks. Base, diffuser support and rod made of epoxy powder coated or glossy chromed metal. ON/OFF switch or dimmer switch fitted onto the transparent cable, as requested.




